### Culture and Humanities

- Chorus North Shore - 5,000

Chorus North Shore (CNS) is a chorus consisting of members from many different communities surrounding Boston. The group performs two to three concerts per year as well as sponsors the Honors Youth Choir, a chorus of middle and high school students. CNS’s mission is to foster appreciation and advancement of choral music and give singers the opportunity to learn and perform choral music. This grant is for general operating support.

· Kartemquin Educational Films - 10,000

Having embraced a vision of “democracy through documentary,” Kartemquin Films is a collaborative community which empowers documentary makers who create stories that have real-world consequences and foster a more engaged, just society. This grant is in support of the Diverse Voices in Docs, which provides guidance and development for documentary filmmakers of color in the Midwest projects in formal partnerships with KTQ.

· Society of the Muse of the Southwest - 5,000

Society of the Muse of the Southwest (SOMOS) is an organization that sponsors programs in support of the Southwest’s cultural diversity through the literary arts, both written and spoken, by providing place and resources for writers, readers and learners. It is designed to foster intergenerational dialogue between the people of Northern New Mexico. This grant is in support of the 21<sup>st</sup> Annual Taos Storytelling Festival.

· Gateway Arts - 20,000

Located in Brookline, MA, Gateway Arts is an organization that gives adults with disabilities a studio space to create art. Along with this, Gateway Arts provides individualized services and supports meaningful lives and careers in art. This grant is in support of reopening the storefront after closing due to the pandemic.

· Intrarte/Koufonisi Music Festival - 7,000

The Koufonisia Music Festival takes place in Ano Koufonisi, a small Greek Island. The festival was created to connect to the past, as well as to understand the rich history and culture of the region, all through the medium of music. This grant is for general operating support.

· Origin Theatre Company - 10,000

The Origin Theatre Company is an organization whose goal is to introduce influential pan-European artists to America, as well as create an authentic dialogue between international playwrights and global audiences. Origin Theatre Company hosts many

events and programs throughout the year, serving over 15,000 audiences annually through its cultural programming. This grant is for general operating support.

· West Palm Beach Library Foundation - 2,500

West Palm Beach Library Foundation is an independent library that was formed to support the Mandel Public Library of West Palm Beach. The Mandel Public library provides free quality programs, services, and resources that enrich and strengthen the surrounding community. This grant is for general operating support.

### Education and Youth

· Apprentice Learning - 15,000

Apprentice Learning is an organization that helps to expose kids to healthy and positive work environments, as well as provides a meaningful experience of education and the working world. This grant will support a program that teaches digital skills used in a work environment.

· Afghanistan Skateboarding - 3,000

Afghanistan Skateboarding is an organization whose goal is to empower children through education and skateboarding. Founded in 2008 in Kabul, Afghanistan Skateboarding helps children throughout Afghanistan, Cambodia, and South Africa using art-based education. This grant is for general operating support.

· American Indian Services - 10,000

American Indian Services is a nonprofit based in Salt Lake City, with a mission of creating programs and generating funding that will help Native Americans receive education while preserving their culture. This organization helps students at the undergraduate level with scholarships and provides STEM programs for middle schoolers. This grant is for scholarship funding.

· Camp Ondessonk - 10,000

Located in the Shawnee National Forest of Southern Illinois, Camp Ondessonk is a program dedicated to providing youth outdoor education and hands on experience in nature. Camp Ondessonk offers many different programs created for a range of ages throughout the year, and has a wide variety of exciting activities for the students to participate in. This grant supports the scholarship fund.

· Cape Cod Academy - 5,000

Cape Cod Academy is a nonprofit independent and coeducational college preparatory day school, servicing grades Kindergarten through 12. Its mission is to create a safe, value-centered community, which fosters academic excellence and the development of life skills through curricular and extracurricular activities. Their mission is centered on the four, long-standing pillars of: Honesty, Respect, Scholarship, and Compassion. This grant is in support of financial aid.

· Cape Cod Lighthouse Charter School - 2,500

The Cape Cod Lighthouse Charter School is a regional Commonwealth charter school serving sixth, seventh, and eighth-graders from Cape Cod. With an average class size of 19 students, Cape Cod Lighthouse Charter School fosters academic achievement and intellectual development through experiential, interdisciplinary learning. Students at CCLCS learn through a project-based curriculum which values exploration and discovery in order to see the practical applications of classroom material. This grant is in support of Art Spark, an after-school arts enrichment program.

· Careyes Foundation - 15,000

The Careyes Foundation, based in the Costalegre region of Jalisco, Mexico, provides resources and education for local children and families. Programs offered are related to learning the English language, outdoor recreation, conservation, and the arts. This grant is for general operating support through the pandemic, including access of remote instruction.

· Choose 180 - 10,000

Choose 180 is an organization in the Seattle area that empowers youth to choose positive change in their lives, with an overall goal of disrupting the school to prison pipeline. This organization uses restorative practices, providing programs that help young people who are at risk of criminal engagement to choose a different direction. This grant is to support the creation of the Director of Community Engagement and Systems Innovation position, technical assistance, and policy development.

· Coaching4Change - 20,000

Coaching4Change is an organization that recruits and trains college students to become ambassadors for change within their own communities. Undergraduate students are able to partner with younger kids to create a positive cycle of change. This grant is for support of programs based in Attleboro and Fall River Public Schools for the 2020-2021 academic year.

· Fivers Children's Foundation - 10,000

Fivers Children's Foundation is a youth development organization for low-income students in the NYC area. Through summer camp and after school programs, Fivers Children's Foundation aims to empower children to make ethical and healthy decisions, become engaged citizens, stewards of the environment, and succeed in school, careers, and life. This grant is for general operating support.

· Florida Atlantic University - 5,000

Florida Atlantic University, Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts & Letters, the third largest of Florida Atlantic University's ten colleges, serves all of FAU's students by providing humanities, social sciences, and fine arts classes, which fulfill the Intellectual Foundations (core) classes required for all degrees. The mission of the college is to prepare students to engage the challenges of the 21<sup>st</sup> Century and work toward the betterment of the region, nation, and world through research and the critical thinking fostered by creative work. This grant is in support of the Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts and Letters' Student Scholarship Fund.

- Friends of Trinidad State Jr. College - 20,000

Friends of Trinidad State Jr. College is a charity with the goal of supporting Trinidad State Jr. College through funding. This college offers its students many skills that can be used in the real-world while also maintaining traditional and artistic talents. This grant is for the building of a museum complex.

- Greenwich Academy - 15,000

Greenwich Academy was founded in 1827 and is the oldest all-girls school in Connecticut. GA is a college-preparatory day school for grades Pre-k through Group XII. GA provides a challenging, comprehensive educational experience grounded in a rigorous liberal arts curriculum within an inclusive and diverse community. This grant goes towards financial assistance for girls who want to attend GA but do not have the sufficient means.

- Hawthorne Valley Association - 5,000

Hawthorne Valley Association, founded in 1971 in Columbia County, New York, is a nonprofit organization that aims to reintegrate agriculture, education, and the arts into the lives of children, as well as society as a whole. Hawthorne Valley primarily serves children from low-income families through many different educational and experiential programs. One youth summer program is called Kids Can Cook, which is meant to strengthen the connection between children and the living land. This grant is in support of the Kids Can Cook Program.

- He is Me Institute - 15,000

He is Me Institute aims to narrow the racial wealth gap in the United States by bringing Black men into the teaching profession. This creates a cycle where Black boys can benefit from having teachers and role models to look up to. This grant is for fellowships to Black male college students who want to explore teaching careers.

- Herring Gut Learning Center - 15,000

Herring Gut Learning Center (HGLC) is located in Port Clyde, Maine, and is an organization dedicated to providing environmental education to high school students.

Through hands on experiential learning, HGLC is able to teach students about aquaculture practices for sustainable food and employment opportunities. This grant is for funding of a part-time educator to expand teacher training.

· **Highland Hall School** - 20,000

The Highland Hall School is a Waldorf school located in Los Angeles, California. Their mission is to awaken students' critical thinking, emotional intelligence, as well as artistic expression. This is achieved through many different agricultural, music, and artistic programs. This grant is for general operating support as well as support of the orchestral music program.

· **Hurricane Island Outward Bound School** - 30,000

Outward Bound, a pioneer in wilderness experiential learning, has been a leader in providing educational experiences to youth and adults worldwide for over 65 years. The organization's mission is to promote character development and self-discovery in people of all ages through leadership and teambuilding experiences. This grant is for scholarship funding.

· **Hurricane Island Foundation** - 20,000

The Hurricane Island Foundation is an organization with a goal to promote science education, applied research, and leadership development through educational programs with an environmentally sustainable community. The Hurricane Island Foundation works to educate youth about science, sustainability, and leadership through interactive programs and experiential learning. This grant is for the rebuilding of a deck which is part of a classroom space on the Island.

· **OLICO Maths Education NPC** - 10,000

Based in South Africa, OLICO Maths Education NPC's mission is to change the way math is taught and understood. Using confidence-building techniques, this organization makes math accessible and meaningful to South African youths. This grant is for resource support in response to the pandemic.

· Partnership for Youth Empowerment - 15,000

The Partnership for Youth Empowerment is dedicated to help bring out the creativity that youth have. This organization helps young people become leaders by developing life skills, social emotional literacy, and more through community-based programs. This grant is for expanding online training.

· Plummer Youth Promise - 5,000

The Plummer Youth Promise is an organization that helps children in the foster care system to find a safe, stable, and permanent home. Serving over 289 children in FY2018, Plummer Youth Promise aims to give every young person a family who is unconditionally committed to nurture, protection, and guidance, so that the children will have a successful adulthood. This grant is for the support of the outcome and evaluation system.

· REACH Prep - 20,000

REACH Prep is an organization dedicated to providing educational experiences for Black and Latinx students from low income areas in Connecticut and New York. REACH Prep offers academic and test prep, summer opportunities, college tours, interview prep, internships, and parent programs. This grant is for general operating support.

· ReSOURCE YouthBuild - 10,000

ReSOURCE YouthBuild empowers individuals and strengthens communities through workforce development, poverty relief, and environmental stewardship. Focusing on men and women who have dropped out of high school, ReSOURCE YouthBuild trains students in construction and energy efficiency in order to prepare them for employment in the construction industry. This grant is for general operating support.

· Rural America Initiatives - 10,000

Rural America Initiatives is an American Indian nonprofit organization that works with urban Indian families in Rapid City, South Dakota. RAI has many initiatives involving elementary, middle, and high school students, and provides resources and support for

many individuals and families. This grant is for the purchase of Chromebooks to help tutor and mentor at-risk Native American students.

· **Society for Classical Studies** - 10,000

Society for Classical Studies is an organization dedicated to advancing the knowledge, understanding, and appreciation of the Greek and Roman world through education programs and public engagement. The Classics Everywhere initiative is a newly launched program meant to support individuals and institutions running public-facing performances, exhibitions, reading groups, and other events that engage communities. This grant is in support of the Classics Everywhere program.

· **San Andres Educational Programs** - 10,000

San Andres Educational Program is based in Yonkers, New York, and provides resources and opportunities for homework help, play, creative projects, and mentorship for the students it serves. The educational programs at San Andres are very beneficial, as many of these students are from low-income areas and live in households where English is not primarily spoken. This grant is for general operating support.

· **Thompson Island Outward Bound** - 10,000

Thompson Island Outward Bound is an organization based in Boston dedicated to educating youth about the environment, while using the natural world as a classroom. One program is called Thompson Island's Connections, which, in partnership with Boston Public Schools, provides a multi-year progression of STEM and social-emotional learning for middle schoolers. This grant is in support of the Thomson Island Connections program.

· **YMCA of Greater Brandywine** - 20,000

YMCA of Greater Brandywine, in Chester County, Pennsylvania, is an organization committed to strengthening the foundations of their communities through programs that promote youth development, healthy living, social responsibility, and the acceptance of all people. Under regular conditions, the YMCA serves more than 80,000 individuals and families every year. This grant is for general operating support.

## Conservation and Environment

· The Nature Conservancy of Vermont - 30,000

The Vermont chapter of the Nature Conservancy was started in 1960 and has since helped protect more than 183,000 acres of the state's most ecologically important areas. In addition to acquiring conservation land, the Vermont chapter works to foster conservation and awareness of the need to protect biological diversity. This grant is for general operating support.

· Land Conservancy for Southern Chester - 10,000

The Land Conservancy for Southern Chester is a nonprofit whose mission is to ensure the preservation and stewardship of open space, natural resources, historic sites, and working agricultural lands throughout the Southern Chester County region of Pennsylvania. This is achieved through conservation efforts, environmental education, and historic preservation. This grant is for general operating support.

· National Audubon Society - 10,000

The National Audubon Society is an organization dedicated to protecting birds and their habitats. The Seabird Institute (SI) is a sector of the National Audubon Society that aims to restore the populations of Maine's rare and endangered seabirds and help to educate the population on environmental stewardship. This grant is for general operating support.

· Public Employees for Environmental Responsibility - 15,000

Public Employees for Environmental Responsibility (PEER) is an environmental protection organization, whose mission is to protect public employees who protect our environment. This allows agencies to confront the message itself, and allows employees to speak out about issues concerning natural resource management without repercussions. This grant is in support of pressuring the EPA and NOAA to protect Long Island's drinking water.

· Puget Soundkeeper Alliance - 10,000

Puget Soundkeeper has been working for over 30 years to stop pollution and protect the health of Puget Sound's water resources and the communities that rely on them. One of the organization's three main programs, The Pollution Prevention Program, uses outreach messages, hands-on educational experiences and technical assistance through an award-winning certification program to meet the challenges facing Puget Sound head-on. This grant is for general operating support.

· Saco Headwaters Alliance - 15,000

Saco Headwaters Alliance is an organization whose mission is to protect and preserve the Saco Valley watershed, which covers much of northern New Hampshire and parts of western Maine. SHA helps to keep drinking water clean, provide habitat protection, as well as build the connection between the economy, natural environment, and the surrounding communities. This grant is for general operating support.

· Wild Care, Inc. - 5,000

Wild Care is a conservation-based wildlife hospital dedicated to offering free rehabilitative care to ill, injured, and orphaned native wildlife, and works to reduce the numbers of animals impacted by human activity through educational outreach. The organization has accepted over 25,000 wild creatures since its founding and receives 800 to 1,700 wild animals per year for treatment. This grant is in support of the employment of seasonal personnel.

· Nature Conservancy of Colorado - 20,000

The Nature Conservancy of Colorado's primary purpose is to protect and preserve the land and bodies of water that all life forms depend on. Along with providing ecosystem services, the Nature Conservancy seeks to provide nature a voice when policy decisions are made. This grant is for the support of the Forest Health and Fire Program.

- Georges River Land Trust - 10,000

The Georges River Land Trust is an organization committed to the conservation of ecosystems and traditional heritage of the Georges River watershed. Through permanent land protection, stewardship, education, and outdoor experiences, Georges River Land Trust is able to protect natural resources and wildlife. This grant is for the acquisition of a valuable wildlife habitat island.

- Oregon Environmental Council - 10,000

The Oregon Environmental Council is dedicated to climate protection, safeguarding communities and economy, providing clean and plentiful water to people, fish, and wildlife, and an overall toxic-free environment, all in an effort to protect human health and the environment. This grant is for the Toxic Air Pollution Reduction Project.

### Health and Human Services

- Addison County Parent/Child Center - 20,000

The Addison County Parent/Child Center is dedicated to helping young parents by helping them complete a high school education, job training, and other social services, all while providing child care. This center helps disadvantaged youth parents to become more responsible and prepared. This grant is for a program that teaches students about historical and current systemic oppression as well as funding for families in immediate crisis.

- Commonweal - 4,000

Commonweal was founded in 1976 and is a support organization for the Whidbey community. Through social and emotional support programs, Commonweal aims to create a nurturing, supportive place where anyone impacted by illness, a life-changing condition, or grief and loss can heal. This grant is for general operating support

· Comprehensive Alcoholism Rehabilitation Programs - 20,000

CARP works to break the cycle of hopeless addiction, dependency and resulting homelessness by offering affordable housing recovery programs to homeless and indigent Palm Beach County residents suffering from alcoholism and addiction. These grants are in support of the building of the Men's 12-Step Homes.

· Cultivating Community - 35,000

Located in Portland, Maine, Cultivating Community grows sustainable communities by creating diverse points of access to healthy, local foods; by empowering people of all ages to play multiple roles in creating and restoring a sustainable food system rooted in the community; and by modeling, teaching, and advocating for ecological food production. This grant is for general operating support.

· Collateral Repair Project - 30,000

The Collateral Repair Project works in Amman, Jordan to provide assistance to people who were displaced due to ongoing conflict. This organization helps refugees to heal both physically and emotionally, through community, skill-building, and health and wellness programs. This grant is for general operating support.

· Shanta Foundation - 10,000

The Shanta Foundation, founded in 2006, partners with underserved rural villages in Myanmar to develop healthy and thriving communities by providing a path out of poverty. The foundation has partnered with 23 villages to sustainably improve the

quality of life of more than 10,000 individuals over the course of twelve years. This grant is in support of the Village of Aung Lei Sponsorship.

· Deep Dirt Institute - 10,000

The Deep dirt Institute is a working farm in Patagonia, Arizona where individuals are educated about living in resilient, regenerative, and sustainable ways. Participants gain work experience, knowledge, inspiration, and practical tools that can be applied to make positive changes in their own lives as well as the lives of their communities. This grant is for the Education and Outreach Project and general operating support.

· Family Nurturing Center - 25,000

The Family Nurturing Center helps families throughout Boston and the Commonwealth to create a nurturing and supportive environment for their children. Through parenting programs and support networks, the FNC is able to create communities that promote healthy human development. This grant is for general operating support.

· Food Project - 20,000

Based in the Boston area, the Food Project brings together young people from diverse backgrounds with the goal of building a sustainable and equitable food system. Youth from low-to-moderate income families are able to become leaders and advocates, while helping communities in need. This grant is in support of the youth payroll and purchase of technology for the Sprout Crew.

· Friendship Bridge - 20,000

Friendship Bridge is an organization dedicated to helping Guatemalan women, who are primarily indigenous Maya and live in areas with high poverty rates, build a better life. Over 32,000 women annually are able to participate in education and technical training programs, also called Plus services. This grant is for general operating support and the Plus services.

· Hanley Foundation - 20,000

The Hanley Foundation, based in West Palm Beach and Vero Beach Florida, is an organization committed to combating substance use disorders in surrounding communities. Through education programs, addiction treatment scholarships, and family support services, the Hanley Foundation raises awareness and assists in community prevention of substance use disorders. This grant is for the Lifesaver Scholarship Program.

· Healing Abuse Working for Change - 5,000

Healing Abuse Working for Change (HAWC) is an organization dedicated to providing services to victims of domestic violence. HAWC provides crisis intervention and triage services, a 24-hour hotline, legal advocacy, and more. This grant is in support of an expansion for Children's Services.

· Healthy Peninsula - 10,000

Healthy Peninsula's primary mission is to improve the health and well-being of the residents in Blue Hill Peninsula, Deer Isle, and Stonington, Maine. Three main focus points of Healthy Peninsula are healthy aging, eating, and families, especially throughout the pandemic. This grant is for general operating support.

· Imbali - 20,000

Imbali is an organization based in Johannesburg, South Africa involved in crafts training and skills development for youth and women from disadvantaged backgrounds. The ultimate goal is the creation of job opportunities and economic empowerment for these individuals. This grant is for general operating support.

· Lahey Health and Medical Center - 30,000

The Lahey Health and Medical Center is dedicated to providing superior medical and health care to every patient. This organization uses advanced technology and performs research as well as medical education, which have all been vital while combating the pandemic. This grant is for an online education program for nursing leaders.

· Mass General/ Ragon Institute - 10,000

The Ragon Institute works with Massachusetts General Hospital in an effort to harness the immune system to prevent and cure human disease. The FRESH Project investigates factors that contribute to the persistently elevated risk of HIV infection among young women in South Africa. This grant is in support of the FRESH Project.

· Multifaith Alliance - 10,000

The Multifaith Alliance was created in response to the Syrian refugee crisis. The goal of the Multifaith Alliance is to provide humanitarian aid to millions of Syrians in need through the mobilization of the interfaith response. Along with this, the Multifaith Alliance advocates in Washington, collaborating with other immigration and relief organizations in order to improve the lives of the Syrian immigrants living in the United States and elsewhere. This grant is for the purchase of tents to house displaced families in the Idlib Province.

· Piper's Angels - 7,500

Piper's Angels is an organization whose mission is to provide support and improve the lives of families in the cystic fibrosis community. This is accomplished through awareness and education programs, life-expanding activities, financial support, and research funding. This grant is for general operating support.

· Presbyterian Hospital Foundation - 25,000

Presbyterian Hospital Foundation's mission is to improve the health of communities around the Charlotte area. Furthermore, an ongoing goal is to provide medical care for children at no cost to the families. This organization helps to cultivate a healthy community. This grant is for support of immunizations, translation services, equipment, and COVID-19 infection prevention supplies.

· Supportive Living Inc. - 15,000

Supportive Living Inc. (SLI) is a nonprofit health care organization centered around improving life for people living with brain injury and other neurological disorders. SLI has three program areas of service: Residential, Wellness, and Education. This grant is for the creation of an education and training program to address issues faced by foreign-born, and people of color who provide direct care to the residents.

· Tree of Life Food Pantry - 15,000

The Tree of Life Food Pantry is an organization in Blue Hill, Maine that provides food for many families in the area, many of whom were financially affected by the pandemic. This organization's mission is to provide emergency and supplemental food for the community, provide and sell good used clothing, and foster self-help and education. This grant is for general operating support.

· U.S. Mexico Foundation - 10,000

The U.S. Mexico Foundation is a nonprofit organization whose mission is to promote binational understanding and collaboration between the United States and Mexico. The Morelia International Film Festival (FICM) is a Mexican film festival where new talents in Mexican cinema can be showcased, quality of cinema can be increased, and the cultural and tourist activities in Michoacán can be promoted. This grant is in support of the FICM.

· Vermont Parent Representation Center - 35,000

Vermont Parent Representation Center is a social service organization dedicated to ensuring that children who are able to live safely with parents or other relatives are able to do so. Along with this, the Representation Center offers legal support for parents who have not been investigated well by Vermont's Child Protective Services. This grant is for the design and implementation of a reformed system and operations of the Parent HelpLine.

· Water is Life Kenya -

35,000

Water is Life Kenya is based out of Southern Kenya, a drought prone area. The aim is to improve community access to clean water, improve community management of water sources, and improve community income derived from water-related activities. Water is Life Kenya, since starting in 2007, has completed 18 clean water projects, trained 34 livestock farmer groups, given over 60 microloans, and transformed the lives of over 55,000 people. This grant is for construction of a water storage tank, as well as water troughs and community water points.

· Whidbey Island Nourishes -

3,000

Whidbey Island Nourishes (WIN) is a nonprofit organization dedicated to nourishing youth on South Whidbey Island through providing no-cost, ready-to-eat healthy meals. WIN's programs help ensure that young people have access to the nutrition that they need, which supports optimal development and academic achievement. This grant is for general operating support.

· Yoga Behind Bars -

10,000

Yoga Behind Bars (YBB) is an organization based in Washington state that teaches yoga to both men and women in prisons and jails in an effort to help the inmates both physically and mentally. In addition to teaching yoga, YBB is creating a teacher training program for inmates so they can share yoga with others. This grant is for a yoga teacher training workshop.

· TIDES -

150,000

The Board, at the advice of The Disaster Relief Committee, set aside this amount in support of cases of major natural or manmade events causing significant hardship or social disruption to the nation as a whole, around the globe, or to specific areas or regions.
